Point guard scores 138 points for DIII Grinnell

After a poor shooting weekend, Grinnell point guard Jack Taylor was given the green light to shoot his way out of a slump.

It only took 108 shots for Taylor to make a mockery of the college basketball record books.

Taylor scored 138 points to shatter the NCAA scoring record in Division III Grinnell's 179-104 victory over Faith Baptist Bible on Tuesday night in Grinnell, Iowa.

Taylor, a 5-foot-10, 170-pound sophomore from Black River Falls,

Wis., made 27 of 713-point attempts, was 52 of 108 overall from the field and added seven free throws on 10 attempts in 36 minutes.

“It felt like anything I tossed up was going in,” Taylor told The Associated Press.

Rio Grande's Bevo Francis held the NCAA scoring record with 113 points against Hillsdale in 1954. In 1953, Francis had 116 against Ashland Junior

College. Frank Selvy is the only other player to reach triple figures, scoring 100 points for Division I Furman against Newberry in 1954. The previous Grinnell record was 89 by Griffin Lentsch last Nov. 19 against Principia.

Under coach David Arseneault, the Pioneers press and shoot 3s like nobody else in the country in any level. They've led the nation in scoring for 17 of the past 19 seasons while

ranking first nationally in 3-point shooting for 15 of those past 19 years. But none of them have had a night quite like Taylor — who never saw this coming.

Taylor recently transferred to Grinnell, located about 50 miles east of Des Moines, after playing one season for Wisconsin-La Crosse. He struggled in his debut at the nearby Wartburg Tournament over the weekend by hitting just 11 of 41 shots — including just 6 of his 41 3-point attempts. Still, he averaged 23.5 points a game.

But Taylor started Tuesday's night game off slow

— at least according to his standards. His coaches figured the best way to get him on track was for him to keep chucking, so that's what Taylor did.

“Maybe my cold shooting from the weekend was affecting me,” Taylor said. “But then they started to drop.”

Taylor had 58 points at halftime.

Then he got hot.

Taylor was 32 of 58 shooting — including 18 3s — in the final 20 minutes and averaged an astounding four points a minute in the second half.

“I don't think reality has set in yet,” Taylor said.

Carmelo Anthony and the New York Knicks were amazed by the feat when they heard about it after their victory in New Orleans.

“I never heard of nothing like that. That's like a video game,” Anthony said, an incredulous look on his face. “How can you shoot 100 times, though?” He joked that from now on when someone asks if he's taking too many shots, he'll mention “that someone shot it 108 times.”

Raymond Felton also was astounded by the 108 shots.

“His elbow has got to be sore,” Felton said.

IWA scores upset win over West Oso

The Incarnate Word Academy boys basketball team scored a huge upset Tuesday night, beating West Oso 71-70 in overtime at IWA.

Frank McNiff led IWA (2-5) with 24 points. West Oso (1-2) got big games from its top players — Davon Fox scored 21, Justin Haywood had 18 and Christian Johnson scored 12 — but it wasn't enough.

IWA (2-5) trailed by four at halftime, but outscored West Oso 19-6 in the third quarter to take a 53-44 lead.

West Oso, which is ranked 21st in the state in Class 3A, battled back to tie the game and send it into overtime.

Trailing 71-70 in the extra period, the Bears' Ramiro Castro was fouled with two

seconds remaining, but he missed the front end of a one-and-one. The Angels grabbed the rebound and ran out the clock.

West Oso has lost two straight games after opening the season with a win at Calallen, but losing to Tuloso-Midway on Friday.

“I also was very pleased with my bench.”

“I was hoping we'd give them a better game — we played a good first quarter,” said Texans coach Roy DeLaPena, whose team won the Bronze Division of the McDonald's Texas Invitational in Pasadena last weekend. “They're just a good team.”

Ray didn't help its cause, as it made just 6 of 15 free throws.

“We've been shooting free throws pretty well this season,” DeLaPena said. “I guess there was just a little more pressure today.”

Evans finished one point short of a double-double, as she had nine points and 12 rebounds. Carroll forward Danielle Meador added eight points and 10 rebounds.

Tigers forward Holli Evans scored seven of her nine points in the first half, while Carroll post An'jolieque Woodson had five of her nine points in the third quarter.

Forward/post Jazmen Williams led the Texans with eight points, while post Shanell Stewart and forward Jasmine Gomez combined for 10 points and 11 rebounds for Ray.

Texans starting point guard Erin Longoria, who is trying to overcome an ACL injury that she suffered over the summer, played in her first game of the season and scored one point in limited playing time.

Ray guard Kathleen Bell's baseline runner tied the game at 9 late in the first quarter. Holli Evans' layup off a nice pass from Dia Evans helped Carroll reclaim the lead and started a 12-4 run, which gave the Tigers a 21-13 second-quarter advantage.

Dia Evans' 3-pointer from the right wing and three assists — off nice touch passes — highlighted that key spurt for Carroll.

Stewart scored the final three points of the

frame to bring Ray within 21-16 going into the half.

The Tigers scored the first seven points of the third quarter — Meador and Woodson combined for four points and guard Ceara O'Donnell had a 3-pointer — to push their lead to 28-16.

Ray used an 11-5 run — guard Dori Bonilla's 3-pointer started it and Bell's 3-pointer finished it — to pull to within 33-27 early in the fourth

quarter.

Dia Evans answered with a layup following another stellar touch pass from Whittington and the Texans wouldn't come closer than seven points in the final five minutes, 24 seconds of play.

“This is the toughest place to play, but we have to play teams like this to get us ready for district,” Canales said.

Ray has the rest of the week off, while Carroll

plays in a Thanksgiving tournament in Harlingen beginning Thursday.
