Isles take lead at Southland tourney

FRISCO — The Texas A&M-Corpus Christi women's golf team shot a school-record 292 to jump out to a one-shot lead after the first round of the Southland Conference tournament Monday at Frisco Lakes Golf Club.

Sophomore Vanessa Johnson matched the school record with a 3-under 69 to sit in second place overall at the event, while Nikki Dunn delivered an even-par 72 for the Islanders to sit in a tie for third.

Krista Fenniak posted a 74 of her own for the Islanders to put her in a tie for eighth through the opening round, while Taylor Slagle shot a 77. Lindsay Biehler posted an 83 for her first round of action.

"Everything really came together for us today," Islanders coach Carol Blackmar said. "This was the most consistent we've played all year, and we reaped the benefits with a school-record round."

"I'm so proud of the way we played today. That said, there is still a lot of golf to be played, and we need to have the same focus (Tuesday) and Wednesday that we did today. But if we keep it up, we can definitely win this tournament."

Midwestern State (311) led after round one at 311, with West Texas A&M (318) second, led by Glory Jangthongsiri, who was

the top individual after with an even-par 72. Tarleton State (319) was third, Angelo State (327) was fourth, Cameron and Texas A&M-Commerce (329) were tied for fifth, and Incarnate Word (337) was seventh. The tournament concludes Tuesday.

IWA teams make TAPPS 4A tourney

VICTORIA — The IWA golf teams both qualified for the TAPPS 4A state tournament with a strong showing at the regional tournament at Victoria Country Club.

The IWA girls won the team championship with a 354 score, beating out Houston Lutheran South (391), and advanced to state for the fourth consecutive year. Jaimie Bibby won the girls individual title, shooting a 78, with teammate Gabi Rendon (87) in fourth.

IWA's Will Wallace won his second consecutive regional title, shooting 75 and then winning a sudden-death playoff on the third hole. Teammate Lucas Trevino finished fifth.

The IWA boys team placed second, finishing with a 319 to Houston Second Baptist's 315. It marked the seventh consecutive year the Angels qualified for

the state tournament, which is April 29-30 in Waco.

The sophomore cleared 2.26 meters (7 feet, 5 inches) at the Javelina Twilight Invitational on Saturday, breaking the school record. He entered the weekend with Division II national best of 2.20 meters (7-3). His new best is the seventh-best height in Division II history and fourth best this season among collegiate jumpers at all levels.

BOSTON — Hours before two explosions near the finish line resulted in at least three deaths Monday, Lelisa Desisa of Ethiopia won the 117th edition of the Boston Marathon.

It's just his second race at the 26.2-mile distance. Desisa outsprinted two other East Africans down Boylston Street to win in 2 hours, 10 minutes, 23 seconds. American Jason Hartmann finished fourth for the second straight year.
